ANNUAL REPORT

In 1976, Dan Rooney, owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers football team and the former U.S. Ambassador to Ireland, along with fellow Pittsburgh-based businessman Sir Anthony O'Reilly, created what was then The Ireland Fund. The Ireland Fund and the American Irish Foundation, founded by Irish President Eamonn De Valera and U.S. President John F. Kennedy, merged at a White House ceremony on St. Patrick's Day 1987, to form what is today, The Ireland Funds America.

The Ireland Funds is a global philanthropic network established in 1976 to promote and support peace, culture, education and community development throughout the island of Ireland, and Irish-related causes around the world. With chapters in 12 countries, The Ireland Funds has raised over \$550 million for deserving causes in Ireland and beyond, benefiting more than 3,000 different organizations.

2016 was the first year after the completion of our *Promising Ireland* Campaign. Typically, U.S. organizations experience a 15% to 50% reduction in revenue immediately after a campaign concludes.

However, we are pleased to report that our donors bucked that trend and instead delivered total annual revenue of \$25 million. Notably, this was twice the income of the first year of the Campaign in 2009. This tremendous outcome is a tribute to their generosity and commitment and serves as a great encouragement to The Ireland Funds America. Most importantly, the revenue of 2016 enabled us to support 336 projects doing outstanding work across the island of Ireland and Irish causes abroad. Such projects ranged from Music Generation which has engaged 40,000 children and created 370 new jobs to ALONE, an organization improving the quality of life for Ireland's elder community through outreach and advocacy.

Throughout the year we also delivered on our Development Program to strengthen the capacity of our organization. This included the appointment of new development staff, rolling out of the new communications and branding strategy including a new website and marketing assets. Most importantly, led by the generosity of our donors, we increased the value of our endowment by almost 50%. The fact that these investments in our future are being led by our Board is a great vote of confidence in our future. Speaking of our future, I am delighted to add that a number of our Young Leaders contributed to the endowment in response to the generosity of the Board. A substantial endowment is critical to the long-term of sustainability of any fundraising foundation.

With this in mind and as we celebrated our 40th anniversary throughout 2016, we began planning for the shape of this organization by the time of its 50th anniversary in 2026. Many things have and will change, new needs will emerge and new methodologies will become relevant. However, the one thing that remains constant is the mission set out for us by our founders, Tony O'Reilly and the dearly departed Dan Rooney, which is to help the people of Ireland to achieve a prosperous and peaceful island.






Financials

We have achieved and maintained a 4 star out of 4 star status from Charity Navigator which is based upon Charity Navigator's detailed and independent review of our financial management and reporting structure as well as our corporate governance and transparency policies. Charity Navigator defines this as an "exceptional" designation, with only 5% of American charities having received six consecutive 4 star awards.
