FoodCloud Hubs was delighted and honored to receive The Ireland Funds Flagship Grant for 2017/18. We utilized the €90k provided through The Ireland Funds Grant to support in **engaging the food industry to encourage donation of surplus food, thus directly increasing our impact and contributing to our financial sustainability.**

This funding continues to support us in **scaling the positive impact of our work** to communities across the country.

We have also benefitted hugely from **connecting with The Ireland Funds global philanthropic network in Ireland and internationally** who have supported us with advice, guidance and introductions. The Ireland Funds also connected us with a corporate donor who provided **additional funding of €63,200 in 2017.**

We are very grateful for the support of The Ireland Funds and look forward to continuing to work with you over the coming years to achieve a vision for an Ireland and **a world where no good food goes to waste.**

With the support of The Ireland Funds Flagship Grant, FoodCloud Hubs have distributed almost **5,000 tonnes of food to 379 charities across Ireland. That is the equivalent of approximately 10 million meals.**

How it Works

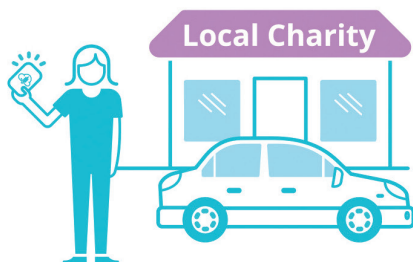
... FoodCloud Hubs



A retailer uploads details of the food using the FoodCloud app or a PDA scanner.



FoodCloud Hubs works with farms, manufacturers and distributors.



A local charity receives a text about the food. They simply text back to accept.



Once the food reaches the closest Hub in Cork, Galway or Dublin, it is segregated and stored.



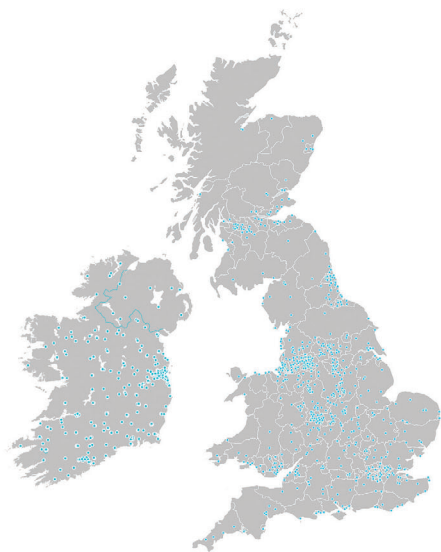
The charity collects the food directly from the store.



Registered partner charities can order food for delivery or collection.

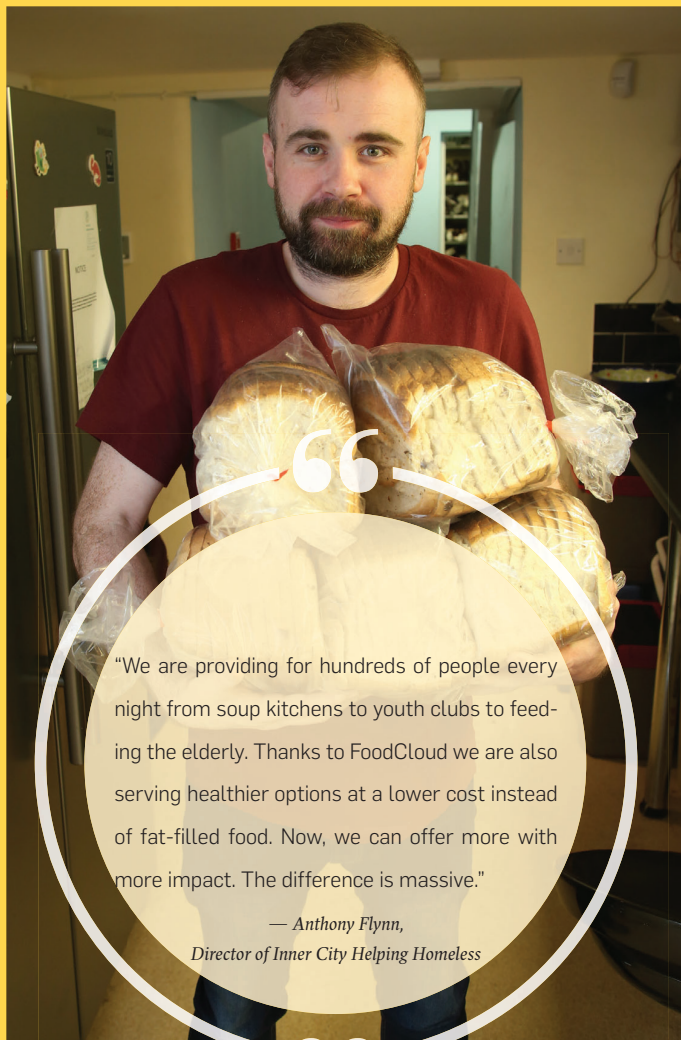

Strength to Strength: Recent FoodCloud Highlights

● **FoodCloud** announced a new partnership with Nestlé Ireland who have agreed to donate their surplus food and pay FoodCloud Hubs for every pallet of goods, which will cover the cost of managing, storing and redistributing any unforeseen food surplus

● **FoodCloud** won the Community Recycling Project of the Year award from the Repak Recycling Pakman Awards for their work connecting businesses and charities in communities across Ireland, avoiding food waste

● **FoodCloud** presented at the European Policy Centre in Brussels on Digitisation as an Enabler for the Circular Economy. FoodCloud Founder Iseult Ward presented at the Forbes 30 under 30 conference in Amsterdam with a focus on how its solutions support the achievement of the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

● **FoodCloud** launched its Galway Hub to further meet the needs to charities and communities in the West of Ireland, helping food producers and distributors get their surplus food to the people who need it most.
