

1976, Dan Rooney, owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers football team and the former U.S. Ambassador to Ireland, along with fellow Pittsburgh-based businessman Sir Anthony O'Reilly, created what was then The Ireland Fund. The Ireland Fund and the American Irish Foundation, founded by Irish President Eamonn De Valera and U.S. President John F. Kennedy, merged at a White House ceremony on St. Patrick's Day 1987, to form what is today, The Ireland Funds America.

The Ireland Funds is a global philanthropic network established in 1976 to promote and support peace, culture, education and community development throughout the island of Ireland, and Irish-related causes around the world. With chapters in 12 countries, The Ireland Funds has raised over \$600 million for deserving causes in Ireland and beyond, benefiting more than over 3200 different organizations.

THE IRELAND FINDS AMERICA

2018 was a very good year for The Ireland Funds and generated revenue from contributions of \$30 million. This was made possible, as always, by the incredible generosity of our donors. Our donors enabled remarkable things for Irish nonprofits in 2018.

The revenue generated not only allowed us to fund 314 projects across the island of Ireland and around the globe, but in particular enabled our Flagship Grants: significant investments that build capacity, core funding and sustainability for outstanding established projects. Thanks to our events and unrestricted income generated, Sensational Kids, Trinity Centre for People with Intellectual Disabilities, Dogs for the Disabled, CyberSafeIreland, Children in Crossfire and the Abbey Theatre each received two-year investments that are helping to scale their impact and increase their reach. We showcase some of those accomplishments and milestones in the pages that follow.

Our event roster was strong with numerous events and an active Young Leaders program. Through those events we were able to introduce our mission to new friends as well as deepen our relationships with existing friends and donors.

People are at the heart of The Ireland Funds and our events continue to serve as a key opportunity to gather and reinforce our love and care for the island of Ireland. There are so many stories of how The Ireland Funds is changing lives and improving the day-to-day lives of people across the island of Ireland and around the globe. On page 4 we share some of that testimony from organizations ranging from The Good Shepherd Cork addressing the family homelessness crisis, to SUAS which is improving children's reading and math abilities. One privilege as an organization is that we get to address such diverse needs and make a difference for thousands of people. This is the core mission of our organization: to harness the power of a global philanthropic network of friends of Ireland to promote and support peace, culture, education and community development across the island of Ireland and among Irish communities around the world.

Support enabled **BLOSSOM IRELAND**

to provide its Gateway Programme to young people with intellectual disabilities. On average, participants increased their social skills by 43.14%, increased their community life skills by 32.5% and increased their preparation for after-school-life skills by 51.88%

Support for MUSIC GENERATION

has helped them reach over 42,500 children with music tuition. Over 350 jobs have been created and music tuition is now offered in 800 centers across Ireland.

Support in 2018 contributed to FOODCLOUD HUBS

transport and logistics costs which allowed them to collect, store and deliver almost 1,000tons of food that would have otherwise spoiled and been disposed of. That is the equivalent of over **2,000,000** meals to over 250 charities across Ireland.


