

Community Sports Network

Regular exercise, educational workshops and teamwork skills from the Community Sports Network helped rehabilitate ex-offenders.

Our Impact: The project helped 66 men adopt physical activities, establish positive routine, and engage in activities such as boxing, football and hiking to stay away from bad influences.

Blackwater Valley Opera Festival

Blackwater Valley Opera Festival is a classical music and opera festival held in Co Clare.

Our Impact: Grant support helped deliver a schools education programme to 2,000 children and young people across 42 schools and community groups. It also provided performance opportunities to 79 artists at an eight-day festival.

Social Entrepreneurs Ireland

Social Entrepreneurs Ireland identify and nurture leading social initiatives. This helps entrepreneurs to amplify their impact across multiple projects, such as empowering women.

Our Impact: Donor-advised grants provided crucial financial backing for SEI, enabling them to successfully reach at least 80 social entrepreneurs, address community needs effectively and provide support in strategy development, leadership, mentoring and coaching.

Read for Good

Read for Good encourages children to love reading and works in schools and hospitals across the UK to make reading accessible and fun.

Our Impact: Seriously ill young patients at the Royal Belfast Hospital for Sick Children were provided with some relief through 500 brand-new books, reaching around 1,200 children and young people.

Irish Community Care

Irish Community Care provide support and services to Irish communities and Irish Travellers.

Our Impact: 78 community members received financial support to ease the burden of the cost of living crisis, while 50 people experiencing social isolation and loneliness saw improvements to their health and wellbeing through making community connections and engaging in cultural activities.

Irish Elderly Advice Network

Learning Hub Limerick
The Learning Hub provides a safe and inspiring learning environment for young people in the Limerick area where they can get support to reach their true potential.
Our Impact: Grant support helped maintain, develop and expand the community garden and café. These have become focal points for the community using the health hub to improve the health of the community for generations to come.



Immigrant Counselling and Psychotherapy
ICAP provides culturally sensitive counselling for the Irish community in Britain, helping to heal and manage emotional distress.
Our Impact: Vulnerable women between the ages of 40 and 60 years benefited from more than 160 therapy sessions thanks to grant support. This was a group of women with the highest demands on them and the least amount of financial and emotional resources.

My Bag Charity
My Bag provides comfort items for every child who enters foster care. Bags and boxes include hygiene products such as shower gel, shampoo and sanitary products.
Our Impact: Young people in care have around £6 a day to live on. Grant support helped My Bag to provide them with some basic food, hygiene and cleaning items four times a year that ordinarily they may not choose to buy for themselves.



No Mind Left Behind Scholarship Programme

No Mind Left Behind scholarships give promising young people from areas of significant economic and social disadvantage in Ireland, an opportunity to both enter and complete third-level education. An annual scholarship of €4,000 is awarded for the duration of their undergraduate degree to cover the costs of books, accommodation, travel and other key expenses.

The No Mind Left Behind programme, developed by The Ireland Funds, is designed to ensure that a student's full potential is met. The Ireland Funds works closely with leaders at DEIS (Delivering Equality of Opportunity In Schools) schools to identify students who will benefit from a scholarship. As many as 98% of our scholars complete their undergraduate studies, compared to 75% of the general student population.

The 100 Club made a significant impact to Luton Irish Forum, an organisation that provides welfare, social and cultural support for the Irish community in Luton:



Grant support helped assist more than 757 vulnerable people who were having difficulties accessing benefits such as welfare, healthcare, social care and housing. More than £1 million was accessed in around 1,000 cases. The impact of such support on clients included decreased levels of stress, anxiety and depression, as well as the monetary gain.
