Thanks to you, 2024 was a transformative year for The Ireland Funds Great Britain.

Your generosity empowered us to grant over £800,000 to more than 50 remarkable organisations, each one making a meaningful difference to the Irish diaspora in Great Britain and to communities across the island of Ireland. This is a year on year doubling of our grant making and is testament to the ongoing generosity and care that our supporters demonstrate for the causes they are passionate about; causes that include tackling poverty and hardship, reducing isolation, promoting inclusivity, and expanding access to education. These aren't just initiatives, they are lifelines for many.

At our flagship fundraising events the Women in Business & Philanthropy Lunch and the London City Lunch, we celebrated the power of giving. These gatherings fuelled our No Mind Left Behind programme, enabling a 24% increase in university scholarships awarded. That means more bright young people now have a path to higher education, changing the course of their lives.

This year also marked some fantastic milestones:

- We launched our Northern Ireland initiative in London, connecting the diaspora to impactful causes at home.
- Our Young Leaders network tripled in size, a powerful signal of the next generation's commitment to philanthropy.
- We partnered with Business Post for a thought-provoking business breakfast, the first of a planned series of events.

Your belief in our mission is what makes it all possible. From all of us at The Ireland Funds Great Britain, thank you for your unwavering support, your friendship, and your generosity. Together, we are shaping a brighter future one grant, one student, one community at a time.







Holy Child Killiney

Holy Child Killiney is a Catholic voluntary secondary school for girls in Dublin.

Our Impact: New modern science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) classrooms have been completed thanks to private donor support. This facility will aim to encourage more female students to pursue STEM-based career choices.

The Blackmore Vale Charity

The Blackmore Vale Charity provides food and services to anyone facing food insecurity.

Our Impact: A soft play area for children, break-out rooms for counselling and a welcoming café for families were all delivered in Blackmore Vale's new hub thanks to grant support.





Irish Cultural Centre Hammersmith

Irish Music & Dance in London

Irish Music & Dance in London promotes traditional Irish arts and positive Irish identity.

Our Impact: 70 young London-Irish musicians aged 11 to 25 enjoyed a fantastic learning experience with professional musicians as they rehearsed and learned to perform in high profile settings.

Parallel Histories

Parallel Histories empowers school students to think critically so that they can analyse and debate contested histories.

Our Impact: Funding brought together young people from Protestant and Catholic communities in Northern Ireland for thoughtful debates on the Troubles. The project fostered respectful discussions in schools and equipped young people with valuable critical thinking and speaking skills.

Social Entrepreneurs Ireland

Social Entrepreneurs Ireland works with entrepreneurs to drive meaningful and lasting social change.

Our Impact: From the Ideas Academy to the Impact Programme, grant funding boosted the number of entrepreneurs supported in their quest to bring innovative solutions to critical social and environmental challenges.

Leeds Irish Health & Homes

Providing services to the Irish and wider community in Leeds for over 25 years through a mission to connect people through care, culture and community.

Our Impact: People with memory loss and their carers enjoyed a weekly coffee morning thanks to grant support. Here, they got advice and enjoyed company and cultural stimulation in a safe environment whilst their carers also benefited from some respite.

Lewisham Irish Community Centre

Lewisham Irish Community Care provides advice and advocacy to support the welfare of the Irish community and prevent poverty and homelessness.

Our Impact: Stories of emigration from the older Irish community in Lewisham were captured online for future generations thanks to grant support. Shared with local groups, the stories celebrate the contribution of the older Irish community in Lewisham.

HERe NI

HERe NI improves the lives of LGBTQIA+ women in Northern Ireland through a range of peer support groups.

Our Impact: Grant funding kept HERe NI's headquarters safe, secure, warm and welcoming for more than 82 women and children as they accessed support to better their emotional wellbeing.

National Gallery of Ireland

National Gallery of Ireland's mission is to care for, develop and showcase art. They are dedicated to bringing people and their art together.

Our Impact: From Rembrandt to Vermeer, grant support helped deliver exhibitions that continued to make the Gallery an exciting and educational place to encounter art.

The Edge

The Edge is a youth centre that helps young people achieve their full potential spiritually, mentally, socially and physically.

Our Impact: Eight targeted groups of young people participated in an eightweek mental health programme thanks to the grant received. The programme helped participants explore stress and anxiety, while introducing self-care techniques.

MyBag

My Bag provides comfort items for children in the foster care system. Bags and boxes include hygiene products, recipe cards, books and a soft toy or blanket.

Our Impact: More than 1000 MyBoxes were provided to 16 to 18 year olds living in semi independent foster care across Nottinghamshire. These young people typically have about £7 a day to live on. A years' worth of sanitary products were also provided to all those requesting them.

Immigrant Counselling and Psychotherapy (icap)

icap is the only British-based counselling and psychotherapy service for those in the Irish community experiencing mental health difficulties.

Our Impact: 436 online therapy spaces were made available to Irish people throughout Britain thanks to funding from The Ireland Funds Great Britain. These were people who would have been otherwise unable to access support.





No Mind Left Behind Scholarship Programme

No Mind Left Behind is an initiative that provides financial support to promising young people from areas of social disadvantage so they can access, and stay in, third-level education. Recipients of a No Mind Left Behind scholarship receive €4,000/£4,000 for each year of their undergraduate degree to help cover the cost of books, accommodation, and other living expenses. In 2024, we expanded the programme to support students from Northern Ireland as well, with an initial pilot of 12 students. The Ireland Funds has seen support for this important education programme increase significantly in the last year.


