



DEAR FRIENDS,

2024 WAS ONE OF THE HIGHEST YEARS OF GRANTMAKING SINCE THIS ORGANIZATION WAS FOUNDED ALMOST 50 YEARS AGO.

Thanks to our donors' unprecedented generosity, The Ireland Funds America made 618 grants totaling over \$26.8 million to support the work of more than 270 organizations.

Our supporters' investment in 2024 addressed critical needs and created opportunity for organizations and individuals. In June, our Heart of the Community Fund brought support to 93 organizations delivering vital services in 29 counties. Then, in December, our Heart of the Community Fund delivered grants to 20 organizations providing essential services to children experiencing poverty, marginalization, and difficult circumstances across the island of Ireland. Our No Mind Left Behind program increased the number of scholarships for students by 24%, an investment from our donors which positively impacts the lives of those young scholars both now and in future.

We're filled with appreciation for what our donor-advised partnerships accomplished in 2024. We worked closely with our donors to tailor significant philanthropic investments around the causes that meant the most to them. These gifts for the greater good are now helping incredible organizations working in education, healthcare, the arts and more.



IMPACT: Donor-advised gifts in 2024 have now helped break ground on a second respite center in Mayo. This new center will more than double the number of children and parents they support each year from 1,800 to 4,000.

EMERGENCY ACCOMMODATIONS AND EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT



IMPACT: Donor-advised gifts in 2024 enabled Good Shepherd Cork to provide educational, therapeutic and well-being supports to over 200 women and children who are homeless in Cork.

In 2024, we worked with our donors to achieve their philanthropic goals with great impact. Our team's understanding of needs and how philanthropy can make a difference across Ireland is unparalleled. We find, fund, and grow organizations worthy of investment. Our expertise enables us to make recommendations and tailor plans with donors, giving them the freedom to focus on their areas of interest. IMPACT: Donor-advised gifts in 2024 ensured 174 Trust could deliver numerous programs that restore hope and promote peace to 200+ families and young people. Gifts also helped its Duncairn Centre welcome thousands of people from the community to participate in arts and cultural activities.

SAILING INTO WELLNESS

EMPOWERING INDIVIDUALS TO OVERCOME CHALLENGES

IMPACT: Donor-advised gifts in 2024 contributed to Sailing Into Wellness' core costs and unique therapeutic programs for 400+ people. The organization serves marginalized communities including at-risk youth, those improving their mental health, those with intellectual disabilities, those in addiction recovery, and those who are homeless.

\$500,000+ in GRANTS AWARDED

20 Organizations

Grants totaling over \$500,000 were awarded to 20 organizations that provide essential services to children experiencing poverty, marginalization, and difficult circumstances. Each organization received €25,000 to support their work. They span a range of services, including homelessness and family supports, education, youth outreach, mental health care, and food provision.

KINSHIP CARE NORTHERN IRELAND, providing advocacy, support, and practical assistance to carers of young children.

LAURALYNN, Ireland's only children's hospice, offering vital palliative care.


HOW DID WE DELIVER FOR THE ISLAND OF IRELAND IN 2024?

NON-FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR GRANTEES

The Ireland Funds has provided us with so much more than funding—it has offered us a truly meaningful partnership that's enriched our mission. Their unwavering support and invaluable guidance have empowered us to make significant strides, such as achieving over 10,000 cardiac screenings in 2024. The connections, networks, and opportunities facilitated by The Ireland Funds, such as addressing guests at the Chicago 40th Anniversary Gala, continue to extend Dillon's legacy, ensuring we can undertake widespread cardiac screening for young people (aged 12-18) and reduce the number of young people dying from Sudden Adult Death Syndrome. We are profoundly grateful for its commitment and belief in our vision.







Workshops The Ireland Funds offers workshops to any organization applying to us for funding. We not only give guidance on applying, we offer guidance that can also be used when applying to other funding bodies and donors to strengthen the organization's chances of success.

VISIBILITY The Ireland Funds promotes the work of organizations it supports across social media and other platforms to share their stories and their impact. Social media, public relations support, and fundraising partnerships help ensure great work gets seen by a wide audience.

Research The Ireland Funds conducts research that serves to benefit both the knowledge base of our donors and the projects they support. This ranges from researching 600+ organizations across the island of Ireland to inform policy and decision making to assessing grant making impact with onsite visits. Research into the Irish diaspora's demographics, genealogy, and cultural, personal and business connections increases knowledge within the community.



NO MIND LEFT BEHIND SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

No Mind Left Behind is an initiative that provides financial support to promising young people from areas of social disadvantage so they can access, and stay in, third-level education. Recipients of a No Mind Left Behind scholarship receive €4,000/£4,000 for each year of their undergraduate degree to help cover the cost of books, accommodation, and other living expenses. In 2024, we expanded the program to support students from Northern Ireland as well, with an initial pilot of 12 students.

The George Moore Scholars program is an ambitious, all-Ireland scholarship program that offers extraordinary supports to talented students in all academic disciplines who wish to undertake a Master's degree in the US, UK, Europe or Canada. The program helps them to realize their full career potential and make a lasting impact in their chosen field.



OUR GRANTMAKING

THE IRELAND FUNDS MAKES GRANTS IN FOUR WAYS:

1 Donor Advised Gifts

The Ireland Funds works closely with our donors to identify and fund organizations in line with our focus areas and their philanthropic interests and goals. We are committed to stewarding our donors' giving, and ensuring their generosity has maximum impact with 100% of all donor advised gifts awarded to a donor's chosen nonprofit following Board approval.

2 Annual Grant Rounds

Each year, The Ireland Funds runs grant rounds which provides nonprofits in every county of Ireland with the opportunity to apply for much needed funding.

Grant Rounds typically award €1 million euro annually and are often the starting point of an organization's relationship with The Ireland Funds. Time and time again, we've seen organizations that have received small grants from The Ireland Funds go on to receive additional funding from our donors, as well as other funders.

Critically, the Grant Rounds enable us to nurture organizations with particular promise, identify emerging areas of need and leaders in the sector, and discover new organizations that are doing essential and impactful work. Funding is available under two categories:

> Small Grants (Heart of the Community Fund)

The Small Grant Round supports small organizations that are making an impact and positive contribution in their local community. Grants typically range from €5,000 to €25,000.

These grant rounds are made possible by unrestricted gifts, and with proceeds generated from our events.



3 Scholarships

Since our founding, increasing access to and excellence in education has been a core tenet of our philanthropy – from early learning intervention initiatives to scholarship programs that ensure our schools and universities reflect every aspect of Irish society, regardless of background.

Our flagship scholarship programs are aimed at breaking down the barriers that Irish students from marginalized communities face in accessing education and helping exceptionally talented students pursue their educational ambitions up to a master's level:

- > No Mind Left Behind gives promising young students from areas of social disadvantage a multi-year scholarship to attend third level education.
- **George Moore Scholars** offers high value funding to academically talented students from all disciplines who wish to undertake a master's degree in the US, the UK, or Canada.

These scholarships are funded by our donors, and in 2024 their generosity enabled The Ireland Funds to award hundreds of scholarships.

4 Special Grants & Strategic Initiatives

In certain circumstances, The Ireland Funds will make special grants to support initiatives that are of strategic importance to Ireland or the Irish diaspora.

This includes funding to promote and nurture Irish arts and culture at home and abroad, support for Irish immigration centers that provide a range of social, legal and pastoral services, local grants to communities that have given so much to The Ireland Funds, as well as grants made in times of tragedy or emergency.

These timely, important and on occasion, urgent grants, are made possible by unrestricted gifts, and with proceeds generated from our events.
